

New Hampshire Electric Co-op crew connecting Marston to the powerlines

The Power to Marston

On a bright warming Monday morning, May 23, 2022, crews from New Hampshire Electric Co-op (NHEC) began connecting the power lines on Old Mill Road to the transformer next to the utility shed at the Marston Farm Recreational Area. According to Jeff Smith of NHEC, they were pulling a 600-foot long 7,200-volt electrical cable, through a buried tube, that will connect the powerlines on the road to the transformer just north of the Marston utility shed. The transformer will be connected to the irrigation system housed in the shed and the well. Later, he noted that electrical power could also be used for food services.
