




The 300th Potluck Cookout at Pawtuckaway: The Details

Here are the directions.

Go to the entrance of Pawtuckaway State Park, 128 Mountain Road. Tell the gate attendant, you and your family are Nottingham residents. There is no charge for admission.



Drive a mile or so and take the first right at this sign.



Then take an immediate first right at this sign,

The Schedule

11 AM- 4 PM Games which will include cornholes, bocce ball, and Frisbee

11 AM- 1 PM Picnicking and eating.

The 300th Committee will provide free of charge the following foods on the tables: ribs, pulled pork, chicken, American Marconi and Cheese, coleslaw, baked beans, and chicken wings as well as water and chips. It will also offer grill hotdogs, hamburgers, and veggie burgers. Please, bring a dish to share, your own beverages, and chairs.

1 PM At the Group Camping Pavilion, there will be a talk on the history of the Pawtuckaway region and the Pawtuckaway State Park given by local historian and amateur geologist, Stephen Soreff, MD.

2-4 PM Boat tours of Pawtuckaway Lake provided by 4 pontoon boats provided by the [Pawtuckaway Lake Improvement Association](#) (PLIA). The boarding of these boats will be at the Park Store. The tours are free and on a first come first serve basis for two hours. There will be plenty of time for anyone attending the event. The store boarding site is a 5 to 10-minute walk from the Pavilion or a quick walk to the main Pavilion parking lot if you wish to drive over to it. There are also signs directing the way to the waterfront.
