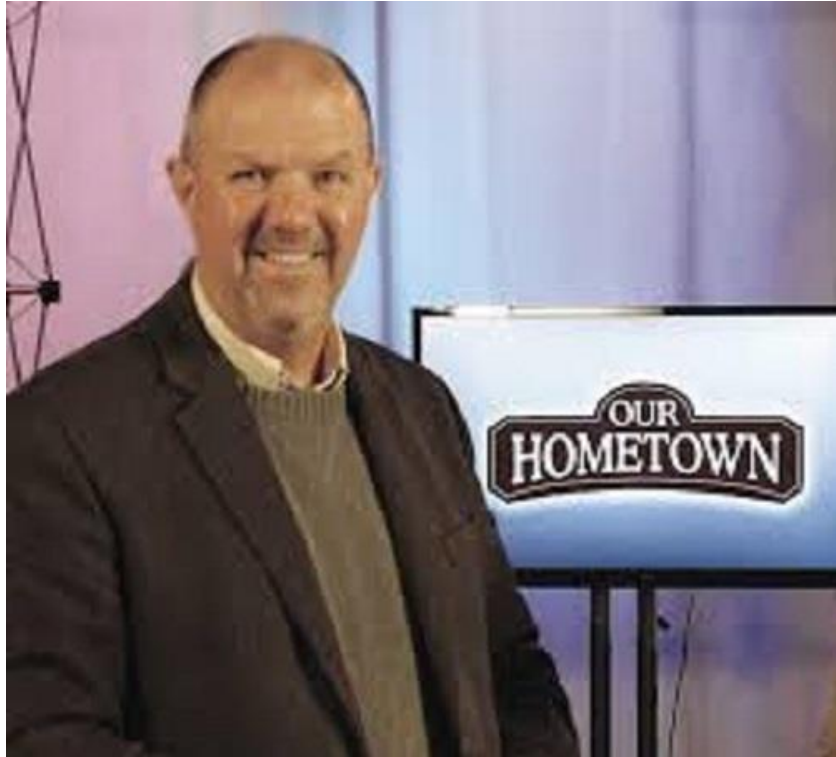
New Hampshire Public Broadcasting Service's (NHPBS)'s *Our Hometown* will feature Nottingham on its Thursday, November 17, 2022, at 9 PM. As [Our Hometown](#) says, "No one knows your hometown like you. The premise of NHPBS's award-winning *Our Hometown* series is that each New Hampshire town and city has a unique story to tell, and the people who live there are ideal storytellers for their hometowns. It is great that this show selected Nottingham as the town is in the midst of the yearlong celebration of its 300th anniversary.

In an exclusive interview with Becky Rule on October 27, 2022, she offered these impressions of Nottingham from doing this production. She went on to say about the show, "Nottingham people welcomed us, and the strongest impression coming through was how proud they were of their town and its history". She has been telling stories in New England, especially New Hampshire, for more than 20 years. She hasn't visited every town in the Granite State, but pretty close — speaking at libraries, historical societies, rotaries, clubs, church groups, and charitable organizations. Some of her talks are sponsored by the NH Humanities Council, which named her one of 40 Over 40, that is, one of 40 NH folks who over the past 40 years of the Council's existence ‘have demonstrated what it means to create, teach, lead, assist, and encourage human understanding. This Massachusetts native now resides in Nottingham, NH.
